
September Worksheet: Safe People

you can trust.




Things that make a Safe Person:

- An adult who listens to me
- An adult who does NOT laugh at me
- An adult who I can TRUST
- People who do NOT drink and use drugs.
- People who really care about me.

Things that make an Unsafe Person:

- · Someone who lies to me
- Someone who is often angry or aggressive
- · Someone who does not listen to me
